

**BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN  
WORKSHOP MINUTES  
APRIL 15, 2015

The meeting of the Borough of Interlaken was called to order at 7:05 p.m., by Council President White. It was followed by a salute to the flag and a moment of silence. **1. RECREATION EVENTS - *Upcoming Garage Sale Event, Annual Picnic***

Council finalized plans for the garage sale. Arrangements were made for Council members to put balloons on the participating houses.

Borough Administrator Reibrich will make arrangements to rent a helium tank from Seaboard Welding and also verify that Chief Ronan has been notified of the sale.

Council discussed the date for the picnic. Council had been considering combining the picnic with the 5K race. The date for the race could not be changed. The date of the 5k is October 17, 2015.

Councilman Miller stated that the Interlaken 5K will be held Saturday, October 17<sup>th</sup> which is the same weekend as always. The time is the same and the applications are printed. AJ Perri is the first sponsor. Sponsor's names will be put on website. Letters have been sent to last year's sponsors. The deadline for sponsorship is the Monday, October 12, 2015 prior to the race. Sponsorships are \$1,000 for title sponsor. Additional sponsorships are available for \$500 and \$250. We are looking for local people to sponsor the race. There is a commitment from Sunset Farm.

Council discussed and set the date for the picnic for August 29, 2015 with the rain date of August 30, 2015. The start time for the picnic was discussed.

Picnic activities were discussed. Council would like the picnic to attract more adult attendees. A committee will get together to discuss picnic activities.

Council President White discussed the need for volunteers.

Councilman Miller made an appeal to residents in attendance to volunteer.

Councilman Horowitz asked that there be a recreation committee meeting.

Councilman Miller stated that the Easter Egg Hunt was a joint event with Allenhurst.

Business Administrator/Clerk stated that Gina Kneser assembled the prize baskets and dropped them off. Business Administrator/Clerk Reibrich stated that it is always a good event and that Ms. Kneser saw some familiar Interlaken residents at the event.
