Mayor Brown gave an update on TFH, I spoke with Mr. Axelrod and expressed our concerns again. We will be meeting, but he is currently out of the Country. I do not know if they will be meeting with the lawyers or what yet. Will keep everyone posted after they meet.

Mayor Brown also stated that there is an upcoming election and encourages everyone to come out and vote; has spent the last 20 years sitting on boards, council and as Mayor, serving the residents of Neptune City but is not running for re-election, appreciates everyone for the opportunity. Has tried to stay out of the campaign but received a mailer with a picture of me on it with some concerns of mine. Mayor Brown stated he never ignored TFH, spoke to them many times, can go back and review meeting minutes to verify. Regarding fleeing businesses from Neptune City, this is also not true, since I took office back in 2010; there are more businesses in Neptune City now. Crumbling infrastructure, since 2010 as Mayor, we have repaved miles of roads; sidewalks have been made ADA compliant, the boardwalk, parks; they tag horseshoe crabs down at Memorial Park. The water is clean, all the records indicate this. The infrastructure is not caving in town. Several years ago, Mr. DeVos and I created a system for relining the sewer lines; some get done every year, not because they are crumbling to help prevent it. As far as property taxes, for the past four years the tax rate in Neptune City has stayed flat. I explain it every year at every budget process, the tax rate and tax levy are two different things. Tax levy goes up in every municipality, due to the cost of things going up, like health insurance, raises etc. In my nine years here as the Mayor I have secured over 4 million dollars in grant money for the infrastructure in Neptune City. Do your own homework and check the facts. Mayor Brown thanked everyone for all the years being able to serve the residents in Neptune City. Neptune City is fiscally sound, not many towns can say that they have no debt, but Neptune City can. You can ask the finance committee. Neptune City does not waste your tax money.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION –

Bruce Wescott, 41 Third Ave, is it possible to get a light at Joe Freda Park, at night it is really dark over there. Mayor Brown stated that the parks are closed from dusk to dawn, but will look into the light over at the park; it was discussed at a committee meeting. Mr. Westcott asked why we are acknowledging Breast Cancer and Domestic Violence Awareness at the end of the month instead of the beginning of the month, where we can promote it more. Mayor Brown stated that it should have been. Mayor Brown thanked Mr. Wescott for his time on the Neptune City Board of Education; he did not seek reelection this year but did a great job while he was serving.

Sharon Williams, questioned what was wrong with Windsor Ct with the Bond Ordinance being needed. Mayor Brown responded that it was just a change order. Ms. Williams also questioned why the street sign was changed from Windsor Ct to Windsor Ave. Mayor Brown answered that the tax map has it as Windsor Avenue. We will follow up with the County Clerk's Office to see what they say. Ms. Williams also wanted to add that it smelled real bad at the house from TFH. Mayor Brown asked if it was called in, Ms. Williams said no, because then you have to wait like two hours from them to come, but by the time they come, the wind has shifted and the smell is gone already.

Arlene Sciarappa, 14 Tucker Drive, curious on the Bill List for Avakian for Third and Union, is that for road

repair. Mayor Brown responded, yes it was for road repair.

C/Calhoun stated that it was brought to his attention that it was National 1st Responder's Day today and wanted to draw attention to all the 1st Responders in town and the State.

Suzanne Collado, Laurel Ave, questioned why we are waiting for Mr. Axelrod to return from international travel before we demand this company to be a good neighbor and stop poisoning our town. Mayor Brown responded that he is the person that will handle all of it; he is the boss and makes the decision. Ms. Collado wants the record to show that we are just asking why we are waiting on somebody who is traveling internationally to just take this boot off of our neck already.

C/Renee made a motion to withdraw motion to adjourn, seconded by C/Kocsis. Approved unanimously by roll call.

C/Kocsis updated that bathrooms at Memorial Park are now closed for the season as of today and brush collection will end on December 1st , and leaf collection is in progress.

C/Renee stated that they had an Administrative and Justice meeting on October 24th and we did speak about the lights at different parks, just to let everyone know. Also, down at the Community Center on Monday November 25th there will be a buffet luncheon from 12:00 – 1:00 pm for Neptune City residents only, call to make your reservation, only \$5 per person.
