

**BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN
WORKSHOP MINUTES
NOVEMBER 12, 2015
7:00 P.M. AT BOROUGH HALL**

The workshop meeting of the Borough of Interlaken was called to order at 7:00 p.m., by Mayor Nohilly. Sunshine Statement was read by Borough Clerk Reibrich. “The notice of the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act has been satisfied by forwarding annual notice to the Coaster and Asbury Park Press. A copy of the annual notice is posted on the Borough bulletin board and is on file in the Borough Clerk’s office.”

1. FIRST AID REQUEST – Discussion regarding the purchase of a cot lift for the ambulance

Borough Administrator Reibrich stated that she discussed the purchase and the requirements with First Aid Captain, John Hansen. Captain Hansen stated that installing the cot lift while the ambulance is being built will be more cost effective than having the ambulance retrofitted, at a later time.

Council had a brief discussion and agreed to approve the cot lift purchase for the ambulance. It will be prudent to have the cot lift installed at this time, as it will most likely become a mandated requirement in the future.

2. NEW BUSINESS –

Councilman Gunn stated that he was contacted by the Coaster regarding the issue discussed at the previous meeting involving dumpsters and pods. He felt that there was an active debate during the previous meeting and the matter had been decided. Councilman Gunn said that was contacted after the meeting for a quote. He stated that advised the Coaster that the issue did not warrant an article, as the matter would not be pursued by Council. Councilman Gunn asked Councilman Franks, if he contacted the Coaster regarding this issue.

Councilman Franks stated that he had contacted the Coaster before the October 21, 2015 meeting to inform reporter Don Stine that the topic would be discussed. Councilman Franks stated that Don Stine was previously provided an agenda and was aware the topic would be discussed. After the meeting, Don Stine phoned Councilman Franks to determine the outcome of Council’s discussion. Councilman Franks stated that he advised Don Stine that Council determined it was not going to pursue the matter.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Mayor Nohilly opened the floor for public comment.

With no public present for comment, Mayor Nohilly closed the floor.

3. ADJOURNMENT- With no Council comments, Councilman Franks made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Gunn and unanimously carried.
