

**BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN  
WORKSHOP MINUTES  
DECEMBER 18, 2019  
7:00 P.M. BOROUGH HALL**

The workshop meeting of the Borough of Interlaken was called to order at 7:00 p.m., by Mayor Nohilly. Sunshine Statement was read by Borough Clerk Reibrich. “The notice of the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act has been satisfied by forwarding notice to the Coaster and Asbury Park Press. A copy of the notice is posted on the Borough bulletin board and is on file in the Borough Clerk’s office.”

1. **PROPOSED PARK SURVEY** – Mayor Nohilly led the discussion regarding the proposed park development survey. Mayor Nohilly provided Council with a map of the proposed park development plan that prompted the previous survey in 2008 noting that the items listed on the previous survey were based on the park plan. Council discussed the list of survey items. Mayor Nohilly stated that the Board could recommend other items, if desired, and suggested outdoor fitness equipment.

Council discussed distribution methods for the survey, as well as, the use of a scale to determine agreement for each item.

Council will make a final review of the survey to be sent to residents during a January workshop meeting. It is expected that the survey will be sent to residents in February.

Mayor Nohilly opened the floor for public comment.

Jodi Heinz, 512 Bridlemere Avenue, stated that she approved of the idea about the path to the tot park. Ms. Heinz thanked the Council for installing a menorah. It is really wonderful. Ms. Heinz also noted to Council that there was a tragic loss of a young Borough resident.
