#### 6. <u>RESOLUTION 2019-39:</u> AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH MOSQUITO CONTROL DIVISION TO CONDUCT AERIAL MOSQUITO CONTROL OPERATIONS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN

#### AUTHORIZING MONMOUTH COUNTY MOSQUITO EXTERMINATION COMMISSION TO APPLY MOSQUITO PESTICIDES

**WHEREAS**, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:9-27 et seq. has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or exterminate mosquitoes within the county; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has instituted an Integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control, and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population within the county of Monmouth; and

**WHEREAS**, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operations over a designated "congested area," the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulation (FAR Part 137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision over which the aircraft is to be operated; and

**WHEREAS,** the Borough of Interlaken is designated as a "congested area" by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Interlaken, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, hereby authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division or its agent to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the municipality designated

by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat or areas harboring high populations of mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a health hazard or both understanding that:

- a. The County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial applications by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies, and
- b. Such operations will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations, and
- c. The County will notify the police department of each municipality over which aerial pesticide operations are planned prior to commencement of such operations.
