

WORKSHOP MINUTES
MAY 18, 2022
7:00 P.M. AT BOROUGH HALL

The workshop meeting of the Borough of Interlaken was called to order at 7:00 p.m., by Mayor Nohilly. Sunshine Statement was read by Municipal Clerk/Administrator Reibrich. 1. **NEWSLETTER** – *Discussion and approval of the Borough Newsletter*

Upon the request of Mayor Nohilly, Municipal Clerk Reibrich made copies of the newsletter to hand out to the members of Council. At this time, Mayor Nohilly and the Council allowed for public comment from Alison Cernigliaro, 412 Windermere Avenue.

Ms. Cernigliaro questioned the surveying of the cove by her home and asked about the validity of the rumors of the installation of a kayak ramp and kayak racks. Mayor Nohilly explained that Open Space Grant Park and Borough Improvements and that includes these improvements. Ms. Cernigliaro questioned the location of the racks and setbacks to her property. Borough Attorney Shaklee explained that the Borough does not have the same requirements on its own property as residential zoning. Mayor Nohilly assured Ms. Cernigliaro that anything that will be placed at the cove will not be an eyesore and that the ramp and racks will fit in the location in design and looks.

The Governing Body discussed the newsletter and its contents as well as the centennial celebration.

BA Reibrich reminded the group that the newsletter will be paid for with Clean Communities Grant funds because it will contain the recycling newsletter as an insert.

With few changes suggested, the newsletter will have some corrections made and be sent out shortly to be printed and mailed to all residents.
