3. **ORDINANCE 2020-3: BOND ORDINANCE**

**BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS AND APPROPRIATING \$332,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$152,950 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY**

*ORDINANCE 2020-3 WAS POSTED IN BOROUGH HALL AND ON THE OFFICIAL BOROUGH WEBSITE ON JULY 15, 2020 AND ADVERTISED IN FULL IN THE COASTER ON JULY 23, 2020. SUPPLEMENTAL DEBT STATEMENT HAS BEEN FILED WITH THE DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES. PUBLIC HEARING WAS SET FOR AUGUST 19, 2020.*

**Bond Ordinance No. 2020-3**

**BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS AND APPROPRIATING \$332,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$152,950 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Interlaken, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$332,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, and including the sum of \$8,050 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 *et seq.*, and \$171,000 grant funds expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$152,950, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3 (a). The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of the projects listed below, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough, and the estimated cost of each project, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes, and the period or average period of usefulness of the improvements are as follows:

- (i) road improvements to Iona Street, with a total appropriation and estimated cost of \$214,000, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes therefor of \$40,850, grant funds in the amount of \$171,000 from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, and an average period of usefulness of 10 years;
- (ii) various road improvements, with a total appropriation and estimated cost of \$108,000, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes therefor of \$102,600, and an average period of usefulness of 10 years; and
- (iii) acquisition of computer and printer equipment, with a total appropriation and estimated cost of \$10,000, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes therefor of \$9,500, and an average period of usefulness of 5 years

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$152,950, as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$332,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The excess of the appropriation of \$332,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of said \$8,050 down payment and the New Jersey Department of Transportation grant in the amount of \$171,000.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 9.84 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$152,950 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$59,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.

Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, excluding the grant funds referred to in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

4. **PUBLIC HEARING FOR 2020 OPEN SPACE GRANT APPLICATION**

**Public Hearing for an application being made to the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Grant Program for Recreation Improvements to Bridlemere Avenue Park including walking path, gazebo, training fitness station, pickle ball lining and other miscellaneous improvements and amenities to Block 30, Lot 20 located on Bridlemere Avenue. Advertisement for the public hearing was published in the Coaster on August 6, 2020 with a full description on how to attend and participate. Public hearing information was posted on the Borough website with the accompanying documents that will be discussed as well as information on how to attend and participate.**

Mayor Nohilly and Borough Engineer, Peter Avakian, gave a presentation regarding the Grant Application for the Park and Lakefront Improvements.

Mayor Nohilly discussed the key points being considered stating that the Park has not been upgraded in 18 years. The current playground does not offer a lot of options for children under the age of 3. The lakefront needs cleaner access points to encourage residents to enjoy and appreciate the importance of

our significant Deal Lake frontage. Kayak/canoe launching can be improved with better access which can increase resident use of the Deal Lake.

Mayor Nohilly discussed a Borough wide survey conducted that was utilized as a guide to help make decisions on the improvements. The residents do not want large attraction features such as dog parks, skate parks or basketball courts. Park improvement features with a lot of support in the survey was for a tot lot, a walking path, shaded pavilion, some additional benches, and flower garden to enhance the beauty. Residents were interested in adding Pickle Ball lines to the current tennis court to make the multipurpose.

The Governing Body wants to retain the wide-open, green aesthetic of the natural and historic park. Residents expressed a desire to keep the same look we have today viewed from Bridlemere Avenue. The Council discussed the addition of some features and upgrades to the park without changing the overall appearance of open space. The features include a new tot lot to be located by the current playground which will need upgrades, a shade pavilion, a small fitness station unit of a few items grouped together and a perimeter walking path.

The lakefront on Borough owned property has naturalized leaving few access points for residents and families to get down to the water to appreciate the Lake. The Governing Body wants to provide two to three access points along Bridlemere in the form of stone steps with a handrail to walk down to the 8-10' to the water. The Windermere Cove will be upgraded in a subtle way, keeping the natural aesthetic, adding canoe/kayak access to the water which will be mostly hidden from the street level.

Councilman Fama stated his concerns about being sensitive to the issues that lakefront improvements could bring such additional traffic and parking in the residential only Borough. He encouraged the Council to consider ways to combat anything that would negatively impact the current quiet state of living that Interlaken enjoys.

The Governing Body discussed how multiple public meetings were held to go over the features and allow for public discussion.

With no further comments, Councilwoman Maloney made a motion to open the public hearing for the Open Space Grant, seconded by Councilman Watson and unanimously carried.

5. **RESOLUTIONS 2020-67: AUTHORIZING THE OPEN SPACE GRANT APPLICATION**

**MONMOUTH COUNTY OPEN SPACE GRANT APPLICATION**

**WHEREAS**, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders has approved an Open Space Trust Fund and established a Municipal Open Space Program to provide Program Grant funds in connection with municipal acquisition of lands for County park, recreation, conservation and farmland preservation purposes, as well as for County recreation and conservation development and maintenance purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of Borough of Interlaken desires to obtain County Open Space Trust Funds in the amount of \$175,000 to fund Interlaken Park, Bridlemere Avenue, Lot 20, Block 30; and

**WHEREAS**, the total cost of the project including all matching funds is \$350,000; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Interlaken is the owner of and controls the project site.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY** Borough of Interlaken **THAT:**

1. Lorie Reibrich or his/her successor is authorized to (a) make an application to the County of Monmouth for Open Space Trust Funds, (b) provide additional application information and furnish such documents as may be required for the Municipal Open Space Grants Program and (c) act as the municipal contact person and correspondence of the above named municipality; and
2. The Borough of Interlaken is committed to this project and will provide the balance of funding necessary to complete the project as described in the grant application in the form of non-county matching funds as required in the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Program; and

3. If the County of Monmouth determines that the application is complete and in conformance with the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Program and the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Municipal Grants Program adopted thereto, the municipality is willing to use the approved Open Space Trust Funds in accordance with such policies and procedures, and applicable federal, state, and local government rules, regulations and statutes thereto; and
4. Lori Reibrich or his/her successor is hereby authorized to sign and execute any required documents, agreements, and amendments thereto with the County of Monmouth for the approved Open Space Trust Funds; and
5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

16. **REPORTS/CORRESPONDENCE**

- ADMINISTRATION/FINANCE No Report
- PUBLIC SAFETY Councilman Watson and Borough Administrator Reibrich discussed the recommendation from the Chief of Police and Traffic Sgt. to purchase portable speed detecting devices. The recommendation was for solar power/battery powered hybrids. This way they can be placed on a permanent pole yet moved around to other locations for 30 days at a time, if needed. Borough Administrator Reibrich and Traffic Sgt. found a very good sale price on two hybrid models of speed signs and they were purchased. The will be coming in 6-8 weeks shipping time.
- STREETS & ROADS Council President Butler recapped the Streets and Roads upcoming projects for Spring and the Grant Application for next year requesting funding for Bridlemere Ave.
- SHADE TREE COMMISSION: Councilman Fama thanked DPW for their incredible work helping the Shade Tree Commission with trimmings and tree removals. The commended DPW for their handling of the tree removals from the recent storm. He informed the Council of the Fall plantings and the spreadsheet being used for tracking.
- PLANNING BOARD: Council President Butler reported that an application was approved at the last meeting. He explained the work that a small subcommittee of the Planning Board has been working on in reference to Land Use and the Master Plan.

- BOROUGH ADMINISTRATOR: BA Reibrich informed the Council of a need to include pricing for mechanical fees in the Borough's Construction Fee Schedule. This will be an ordinance for introduction at a future meeting.
