

**BOROUGH OF INTERLAKEN  
WORKSHOP MINUTES  
NOVEMBER 13, 2019  
7:00 P.M. BOROUGH HALL**

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The workshop meeting of the Borough of Interlaken was called to order at 7:00 p.m., by Mayor Nohilly. Sunshine Statement was read by Borough Clerk Reibrich. “The notice of the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act has been satisfied by forwarding notice to the Coaster and Asbury Park Press. A copy of the notice is posted on the Borough bulletin board and is on file in the Borough Clerk’s office.”

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1. **PROPOSED PARK SURVEY** – Mayor Nohilly led the discussion regarding the proposed park development survey. Mayor Nohilly presented a proposed letter composed by Councilman Watson which was discussed by Council. Council reviewed the itemized list of potential development options to be included in the survey. The 2008 park survey was discussed in relation to the success of execution and results. The previous survey saw a majority approval for the refurbishing of the tennis courts and a tot lot. The Council in place at the time made the decision to refurbish the existing tennis court. The goal of this survey would be to collect input regarding residents’ interests pertaining to park improvements and include those who have become residents since the previous survey. It is expected that the survey will be sent to residents between January and February. The final survey will be reviewed by Council before it is distributed to residents.

2. **100<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY CLOCK** – Councilman Butler proposed that a decorative clock be installed within the Borough to commemorate Interlaken’s 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

Council had a brief discussion regarding the anniversary and the proposal of the clock. Council members were in favor of an anniversary commemoration. A clock may be considered. Various potential locations and settings of the clock were touched upon. The matter was tabled for a future meeting.

4. **COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC**

Mayor Nohilly opened the floor for public comment.

Jodi Heinz, 512 Bridlemere Avenue, stated that the Council has impeccable taste but asked that maybe something more unique and personalized to Interlaken be considered to commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Ms. Heinz suggested a rose garden or sculpture.

Roger Hanke, 312 Buttermere Avenue, complimented the manner in which Council made the review of the park survey.

With no additional public comment, the floor was closed.

5. **ADJOURNMENT:** With no further comments from the Governing Body, Council President White made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilwoman Horowitz and unanimously carried.
